Darren Mack, the guy who killed his wife and took a sniper shot at judge chuck weller told police he was in Mexico and would like to turn himself in. he was a no show according to the u s consulate near puerto vallarta. he hasn't been heard from since the initial call.

from lodi comes our "is nothing sacred anymore" story. A thief stole More than 12-thousand-dollars worth of bronze vases from Cherokee Memorial Cemetery. The cemetery's manager remembers the same thing happening five-years ago.

the Pakistani government has a great idea to bring down their country's rapid population growth. they'll pay for the education of families with only one child. The plan is being launched with a survey starting beginning on July 1st to determine the number of one-child families. Minister for Population Welfare Chaudhry Shahbaz Hussain says Pakistan is the world's sixth most populous country, with a population of 156-million people, and growing by about two-percent a year. Darren Mack is the latest addition to the FBI's Most Wanted list. he's the man who murdered his wife, shot a Family Court judge in a sniper attack in Reno and disappeared June 12th.

Army Specialist Patrick McCaffrey of Tracy and First Lieutenant Andre Tyson of Riverside had originally been reported as having died in an ambush. It is now known they were murdered by Iraqi troops they believed were fighting on their side against the Islamic terrorists that the media refers to as the insurgency.

San Joaquin County prosecutors are amazed a five-year-old boy survived beatings by his mother and her boyfriend. The boy is in Child Protective Services after a tip sent cops to their Stockton home. the toddler has broken bones in his hands and marks on his body from being beaten.

a measure requiring parental notification of a daughter's request for abortion and a tobacco tax increase initiative have qualified for the November ballot.

A hearing is set today for Ricky Manning, a veteran NFL player charged with assault with a deadly weapon during a fight at a Denny's restaurant in April. Manning was part of a group who attacked a man as he worked on a laptop computer. The victim was punched and kicked until he was unconscious. Saddam Hussein has lost another member of his defense team.. well not really lost...we know where he is, it's just that he's now dead. gunmen kidnapped Khamis al-Obaidi one of Saddam's lawyers, near his home in

Baghdad. Obaidi was the third defense attorney to be killed since the start of Saddam's crimes against humanity trial.

the sac county's Board of Supervisors passed an emergency ordinance yesterday, requiring Registered sex offenders to be restricted from areas near children in Sacramento County. Effective immediately, sex offenders will have to stay at least 300 feet away from schools, day care facilities, libraries, video arcades, playgrounds, youth centers, parks and public swimming pools, as well as bus stops near schools and parks. Similar ordinances have also been passed recently in the cities of Elk Grove and Folsom. 26-year-old Shaun Jones of Sacramento, was pulled over for speeding early yesterday, ran away from chp officers and was hit and killed by an SUV. jones was traveling at about 100 miles-an-hour on eastbound Interstate-80 in Dixon. After he was handcuffed he broke away from officers, ran across the road and jumped the center divide. Dallas County isn't taking the cost of illegal aliens lightly they're preparing a bill for the government of Mexico. Judge Margaret Keliher says It's for the cost of treating undocumented immigrants at the county's medical facilities. Keliher says they know of at least 15-million-dollars in costs so far this year. [GrassFire.org](#) has put up its first billboard in the Irwindale area. The billboard near the Foothill (210) Freeway and the San Gabriel River (605) Freeway has the message, "Stop the Invasion: Save Our Border" on it. the campaign is meant to send a message to lawmakers to stop illegal immigration. i've already checked in on [grassfire.org](#), you should too. they believe "The so called legislation that was just passed in the Senate is a terribly irresponsible bill, that offers blanket amnesty and it really opens the door for up to 60-million additional illegal immigrants to flood through our gates." The second billboard is expected today in San Diego, and they're going nationwide.

Daniel J. Broderick was appointed this week by the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals to head the Federal Defender's office. Broderick has served as the federal defender for the Sacramento-based Eastern District of California on an interim basis since Quin Denvir stepped down from the post at the end of last year. The formal four-year appointment could not be made until an FBI background investigation was completed. The 54-year-old Broderick joined the Federal Defender's Office in 1991 and became Denvir's chief assistant in 1999. He was lead attorney in a series of more than 300 habeas corpus cases that successfully challenged the indefinite detention by immigration authorities of immigrants subject to removal from the United States to countries that refused to accept them. Habeas corpus is a civil proceeding that challenges whether a person should remain in custody. As federal defender, he will lead a staff of 29 lawyers and 52 support personnel in Sacramento and Fresno.

Robert Glass left the scene of a crash into a tree on Canyon Valley Road near Diamond Springs early yesterday morning and 1 person was dead at that scene while 3 others are in hospitals. CHP and eldorado county cops are looking for him now and he is susceptible to vehicular manslaughter charges.

Elections were Tuesday in California, but in Nevada County there's still no winner in three local races. The clerk-recorder's office begins canvassing votes today and the

results may not be known until Friday. In Nevada City, city council challenger Barb Coffman has a four vote lead over incumbent Kerry Arnett. Sheila Stein's 484 votes led the City Council field. Coffman had 420 votes and Arnett 416 and there's two openings on the council. In the district attorney's race, Cliff Newell has 50-point-24 percent of the vote, while Jim Phillips has 38-point-05-percent. A third candidate, David Silber, has a little more than 11 percent of the vote. In order to avoid a runoff and be declared the winner, Newell needs a majority of the votes and there's more ballots to count, so he can't be declared the winner. A similar situation exists in District Four, which became a vacant seat after Robin Sutherland decided she would not seek re-election. Hank Weston garnered 50-point-72-percent of the vote, while Martin Harmon received 31-point-66-percent. Gordon Beatie, the third candidate, collected a little more than 17 percent of the vote. At this point, no one knows the precise number of ballots that will be counted today and Friday, so the county registrar won't declare these three races final.
